The work of the acclaimed Victorian architect and designer William Burges, Worcester's Chapel is a cosy, tranquil place for reflection, prayer and music.





Worcester's choral tradition



Worcester College Chapel enjoys choral services five times a week. It is unique in Oxford in maintaining a choral tradition in which our adult Choral Scholars are complemented by boy Choristers, with the adults normally singing on Sundays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, and the boys on Mondays and Tuesdays. The boys are day pupils at Christ Church Cathedral School.

The Choir is led by our full-time Director of College Music, who also has responsibility for looking after the wider musical life of the College including student music-making, managing Worcester's programme of public concerts, and outreach initiatives.

The Director of College Music also supports our undergraduate Organ Scholars as they accompany the Choir in services. Under his guidance, the Scholars learn skills in management and practical arrangements of choir leading, as well as discovering how to train boy Choristers.

The Choir performs a wide-ranging repertoire and a typical music list for the term might include everything from plainsong to newly commissioned works in the same week. Whether performing Byrd, Tallis and Palestrina, or contemporary pieces by living composers, the Choir is proud to be part of a rich heritage in a College whose Music fellows have always been distinguished composers. The Choir also gives regular concerts in College, tours across Europe, and has recorded several CDs.

Organ Scholarships

An Organ Scholarship at Worcester College provides musical training and encouragement unique in Oxford and unusual in the musical world. We always aim to have two Organ Scholars, working together and learning from each other.

Worcester proudly possesses both the oldest working college chapel organ in Oxford and a brand-new chamber organ. We will support you to hone a wide range of skills on these instruments, including developing repertoire, choir accompaniment continuo and realisation. You will also learn how to rehearse boy trebles and conduct the whole choir under the supervision of the Director of College Music.

The experiences and backing offered to our Organ Scholars provide a distinctive opportunity for the life of an undergraduate. Any student championed by Worcester will not simply become a better organist: those seeking to prepare themselves for life as a professional musician will find no better scholarship anywhere.

Support offered to Worcester's Organ Scholars includes:

- Free organ lessons
- Specialist tuition in conducting, accompaniment & repertoire
- Financial support towards RCO diplomas
- Four free singing lessons per term with one of Worcester's exceptional teachers
- Free meals together with the Choir in Hall after each service, usually including two formal dinners each week
- A generous honorarium awarded each year
- Superior accommodation in College
- Bespoke workshops with singers, teachers and conductors
 - Opportunities provided by the University network of organ scholars, the Betts Centre for Organ Studies
 - Regular public concerts and national and international tours
 - A thriving and supportive team of like-minded young singers

Additionally, Organ Scholars are invited to supplement their honorarium by participating in Worcester's local outreach projects such as accompanying the Allsorts Community Choir and the Jericho Youth Choir. Some Scholars have taken up occassional tutoring opportunities with the Choristers.

How to make your **application**

Prospective Organ Scholars are warmly encouraged to visit us at Worcester: the Director of College Music will be happy to talk informally about organ award opportunities, the wider music culture in College, and introduce applicants to current Organ Scholars. Schools are welcome to enquire about bringing individual musicians or even groups of students to sing with the Choir at Evensong.

Organ Scholarships are awarded solely through the University Organ Trials, which take place in September, again for those applying to begin their studies the following year. Up-to-date information about choral and organ awards across the University can be found on the Music Faculty's website.
